Eastview vs. Duluth East

Tonight the Eastview Boys' Basketball Team (4-1, 2-1) play host to the Greyounds from Duluth East (2-4) High School. Eastview is looking to pull ahead in the series. Both schools are 2-2 in the series with the Greyhound winning the last two years. Last season Duluth East won 77-66 in close battle to the end of the game. The Greyhounds nailed 2 3-pointers in the closing minutes to seal the victory. Head Coach Chuck Tolo brings in a very young but talented team this season. They are held by sophomore guard, 6'2" Dyami Starks. He is a great scorer who can hit the deep shot as well as pull up on the drive. It will take a strong team defensive effort to hold down Starks (28.5 ppg). The Lightning, again, are sticking to strong team defense and a balanced offense to gain wins. Currently, they are second in the Conference in defense by only allowing 52.7 ppg. They also spread the offense with 3 players averaging in double figures. The bench has been one of the main ingredients as well. Senior Tim Hufford, Junior Carlos Emory, and Sophomore Vinard Birch have given the Lightning a strong advantage over the opponents. Defense & balance on offense will be needed again.

Eastview 63, Cretin 50


