Tonight the Eastview Boys' Basketball Team (13-4, 9-3) play host to the Eagles (13-6, 11-2) from Eden Prairie High School. Last season the Lightning were able to sweep the season series with a 70-65 OT win at home and a 62-52 win at E.P. In the first meeting this season, E.P. carried a convincing 34-25 lead into halftime. In the second half, Eatview was able to tighten up the defense and hold the Eagles to just 19 second half points. In the comeback, the Lightning held the ball for the final 2:00 of the game and took the lead on a Johnie Sanders jumper with seconds remaining. Unfortunately, it was just enough time for Eden Prairie to make a layup, get fouled, and sink the winning free throw to win by 1 point. With first place at stake, and revenge on their minds, the Lightning are looking to settle a score from December. The Eagles boast an impressive array of power and finesse. With one of the largest front lines in the conference to go along with leading scorer 6'6" Ethan Wragge, the Eastview defense will be put to the test. Both teams believe in their strong defense with each holding opponents to under 57ppg. It will be a tough contest between contrasting styles of play.


