Tonight the Eastview Boys' Basketball Team (10-4, 6-3) play host to the Irish (8-6, 4-5) from Rosemount High School. Last season these two teams split the season series, with each winning on their home floor. Rosemount boasts one of the highest scoring tandems in the league. Seniors Andrew Brommer and Mark Weiloch lead an explosive group of offensive talent for the Irish. The 6'9" Brommer is averaging close to 18ppg and is committed to the University of Iowa to continue his career. Weiloch, on the other hand, is a 6'1" sharpshooting guard. He averages close to 16ppg and is a key cog in the Irish arsenal. 6'8 Tim Sauer completes the biggest front line in the league, and 6'2" Trov Hoeppner provides additional scoring and slashing from the perimeter. It will take a very strong defensive game from the Lightning tonight in order to gain a much needed conference and section win. Defensively, the Irish will mix up their zone defenses in hopes of keeping the offense confused and off balance throughout the night. Once again, the Eastview defense will need to generate offense if it hopes to control the tempo and the game tonight. It should be a fun one between rivals.
