Registration/Enrollment Instructions

First time users:

1. Go to <http://www.pearsonsuccessnet.com>
2. (or google www.pearsonsuccessnet.com and click on “login”)
3. Click **Register**
4. On the first screen, type the class access code in the access code field (see above for details).
5. Follow the instructions to register, and write your user name on the blank line above exactly as you typed it. Do the same for your password(see above for specifics).
6. At the end of registration process, the SuccessNet login page appears.
7. Log in by typing your user name and password and clicking on “login”.

- A. Log in as above by going to www.pearsonsuccessnet.com (step 1 or 2)
