- 7. Students with Special Education courses have checked with special education teacher to be certain course selections are correct.

 - These will only be scheduled if my original elective course selections cannot be.
 - For singleton English, Social Studies and PE courses selected, an alternate course for each is recorded in ALTERNATE Box.
- 9. I have completed the STUDENT ACTIVITIES section of the Registration Form AND entered these selections online in Campus.
- 10. I have selected a TOTAL of at least 15 credits for next year. I understand that the minimum number is 15 credits and the maximum is 21.
 - Study Halls will automatically be assigned for any student with less than 21 credits.
 - If student selects a "Zero Period" course they may have 22 total credits.
 - Selected courses will be placed first to make the student schedule work, leaving Study Halls to fill in the gaps.
 - Students will NOT be able to request specific periods of the day for Study Halls due to scheduling constraints.
