3. Turn in this Registration Form and Comprehensive Course List during Registration Homeroom at your school (or to your RHS Counselor).

## Step 1: Getting Started

- Log onto Campus Student available at https://www.district196.org/community/families.
Username = Student ID number
Password = School network password
- Click Log In



## Step 2: Academic Plan Tab

- Click on the Academic Plan tab and then Next.



## Step 3: Searching for Courses

- Click on Search the Course Catalog.
- Search for a course by course number (full number) or by course name (you may enter part of a name if unsure of the full name).
- Click on the course for more information.



## Step 4: Selecting Your Courses

- Add the course from the Course Catalog search.
- The course will be added to the Academic Plan.

-For singleton English, Social Studies and PE courses selected, an alternate course for each is recorded in ALTERNATE Box.

-Students will NOT be able to request specific periods of the day for Study Halls due to scheduling constraints.
